Drill Team/Color Guard: The Drill team is all about thinking on your feet, discipline, and precision. They march, twirl rifles, and learn to execute commands quickly and accurately. Our drill team has sent one team to state this last year.

Raider Team: It is tough! It is the most physically challenging of any high school sport. The Raider mixed team finished second in the state in 2015 and is looking to compete at Nationals in 2016. Competition consists of the following events: rope bridge, obstacle course, cross country rescue, 5k run, and the tire flip.

Rifle Team: Using .177 caliber CO2 powered air rifles the rifle team competes in multiple competitions throughout the year. Teams fire from three standard positions (Prone, Standing, and Kneeling) with 100 points possible from each position. Our team qualified for state this year for the first time in decades and is looking forward to greater success next year.
